1. English
2. Reasoning & General Awareness (RAGA)

Let's understand each section in detail.

Airforce Group Y English Syllabus

English plays a significant role in the examination. Therefore, candidates should focus on grammar, vocabulary, comprehension, and sentence formation.

The English section checks your understanding of the language rather than difficult literature.

I. Grammar & Sentence Structure

This section forms the foundation. Focus on learning the rules first, then applying them through practice.

- Parts of Speech (Noun, Pronoun, Adjective, Verb, Adverb, Preposition, Conjunction, Interjection), Articles, Tenses, Modals, and Subject-Verb Agreement.
- Active & Passive Voice, Direct & Indirect Speech and Question Tags.
- Error Detection, Sentence Improvement & Completion and Fill in the Blanks.

II. Vocabulary

Vocabulary requires daily, consistent practice. Rote memorization is less effective than understanding context and root words.

- Synonyms (similar meanings) and Antonyms (opposites).
- One-Word Substitutions and Idioms & Phrases
- Homonyms, Homophones and commonly confused words.

III. Reading & Comprehension

This section tests your logical flow and ability to understand the language in context.

- Reading Comprehensions, Cloze Test and Sentence Rearrangement

Airforce Group Y Reasoning & General Awareness (RAGA) Syllabus

The RAGA section evaluates logical thinking and awareness of current events. Since it combines two areas, candidates should prepare both consistently. Reasoning questions are generally easy to moderate. However, regular practice improves both speed and accuracy.

- Classification (Odd Man Out)
- Blood Relations (Human Relations)
- Distance and Direction Sense Test

- Mathematical Operations
- Assigning Artificial Values to Mathematical Digits
- Inserting Correct Mathematical Signs
- Number Puzzles
- Dictionary Words / Alphabet Test
- Mutual Relation Problems

Non-Verbal Reasoning
